

# MUSICFOR THE PEOPLE

Europe slides into summer as Sydney collides into the cold of winter, and so the music on the European front takes a new direction. The raves still go on and the clubs are packed with thousands of punters but music has suddenly exploded with new colour.

Currently taking the world by storm are many different styles of music appealing to the same audience. including garage (which is huge in a lot UK clubs), breakbeat, trance. ragga/techno, rave and soft house. Soft house - or deep house - any way you wish to name it, is a more traditional old style sound which generally relies on a lengthy tune with a heavy repetitive bass, usually building heavily, laver upon laver. and an uplifting piano break, not necessarily featuring vocals but generally giving you a feeling of depth. It's also a slower tempo than hard songs like Passion by Gat Decor which is destined for the masses, with the familiar Bassheads-bassline and a chunky kick that pushes the song into cruise mode until it breaks into a warm piano riff that captures a true piano sound. Then, as quickly as it came the bass drops back in and off it chugs until it's almost over... then a piano like no other song rips in. Even hardcore fans would convert this will be massive or I'll eat it! Another interesting soft/garage track is Desafinado by Rhythm 3 Request (released through BMG

UK), the After Hours mix will blow

you away. The intro makes this

track - a lone trumpet blows a tune

(resembling Spanish-style music)

which is cheekily borrowed from

Colonel Abrahams' Trapped. A nice deep bass kicks in, including a clickalong finger snap, also sampling the seductive 'BaybaybaybayBaby' line form Bizzare Inc's Raise Me. This glides along, collecting the lone trumpet sample and cruises off into the night. This one's for the romantics!

An unusual piece of music flying about is an EP titled Stairway to Heaven by Dave Angel (R&S Belaium), but don't judge a book or record - by its cover. This track contains four masterpieces of techno including a fast, winding track called Sighting which kicks in at a hurried pace. You'll sweat on this but the clevemess of this song is that you can cool off as you dance or jog! This tasty tune contains wild wind noises that are so atmospheric you feel the cold in the sound. It's fast, but the emphasis is ambient, building one layer at a time, hence 'Stairway to Heaven'. It actually takes you step by step and when you reach the top a warmth synth sound levels you out and you journey off into the sky as that wind effect blows you off heaven bound. For the hardcore there's the usual abundance of slamming sound that push you over the edge. The remix of the Force Motion EP Vol. 4 on Rabbit City Records gets my vote as an excellent four tracker (which are becoming more popular) with each track destined to push you even further. The best track is Reach Up which samples 'Everybody reach, don't stop, don't stop) and kicks in with a SL2-style breakbeat. As the best hardcore songs do it breaks into a Euro Synth stab that screams - and ves. it has crowd noises and whistles but it's

not meant to be played in your lounge room.

Another good rave tune is Chemical Company's Tronik Equator, out on white label but due to be released through FFRR shortly. This lovely breakbeat style song ha the best of everything including the familiar bouncy beat Moby Go sample and a classic piano riff stolen from JJ Company's Don't Deal With Us. All the elements of a nice but hard beat rave sound

Just when you though Italian house was dead, out pops a release from DFC, famous Italian dance label that many of you have bounced to under their guidance. Their latest offering is a track called El Ritmo Barbaro by Ramirez (of La Muzica fame), which intros with a heavy acid 'farting' noise that starts to wind you up. After hooking you in. a wicked sharp snare sound hisses like a rattlesnake as you start to count, awaiting a beat to set you off. After twenty seconds a pounding beat kicks in along with the hissing and the acid/fart sound. This resembles the repetitiveness of a Hypnotist style song as it takes you on an escalating intense ride. It samples a Spanish voice, very haunting. one for Brainscramblers. It's only 4.50 long but it seems to go on forever, It's definitely not boring and is fun to lose it too. Asta la Vista.

Reviews by Nik the Fish. These tunes plus others can be heard on 2SER every Monday on Musiqarium from 2 to 4pm as Nik the Squid presents two hours of hardcore, soft house, trance and European sounds, new and classic. Lockin or miss the boat!

Ming - Used to mean breakfast, has now become middle of the night snack.

Platform 31 - Somewhere to go to watch SRA workers go off.

**Reach'n Records** - A place for DJs to go when they're not at home or at another DJ's home.

Ticket - If you consider yourself a real raver then this word means only one thing to you. It is generally something you eat or steal off someone after having forged their stamp, or something you totally forget about getting because you spent all your money on other little things (so you can have just as much fun outside the event as you would if you'd secured a ticket and gone inside). If you are a DJ, live with a DJ, carry records for a DJ or sleep with a DJ you also wouldn't know what one is. They're also good thing to hang on to so you can remember where you were last weekend or last night.

Hoon - Something you take to go Hooning.

Also don't forget these last minute hints:

If you've taken drugs tell everyone how many and when. If you had any incidences with the police tell everyone where and when. Yell at beer monsters and trannies as they walk past Flow (to stare snobbishly is also acceptable.)

Remember, these facts are only a grounding and by next week most of these terms will be obsolete, so learn fast and good luck fitting in.

PS. We must all remember that there are just some people out there that even this simple list will not help. You may have seen these people sometime. They live in the real world and occasionally make excursions into ours. You may remember one or two at the last Psychosis. They are not easily recognisable so look out!


