




# this is your week...


off. It is generally the case when you miss a party that it's the best one in ages.)

SPECIES PROSPECTS: Winter months can make life difficult due to harsh climactic conditions and wind chill factor which deters hopeful loiterers making herd duties less social. However, this species is socially adept and well connected which ensures continued growth and survival.

## SO, WHO IS ADRIAN AGE?

Adrian Age is the latest UK DJ to visit our shores to play first in Melbourne and then in Sydney at Tribal on July 4. Hailing from London's East End, Adrian Age began DJing in 1988 at the London club the Labyrinth and he hasn't looked back since. But what really makes this 26 year old DJ stand out from the norm is that he DJs and MCs simultaneously as well as having perfected the art of mixing hardcore with anthemic vocals. And unlike many of the DJs we're used to he really does mix.

### His background:

"I first started at the Labyrinth at the first party they ever did-I used to be a social worker and I started buying records and going out and I just got into the swing of it. I was out one night and I met the guy who started doing Labyrinth so really it was just a lot of luck bumping into him and I haven't looked back since. I used to do other raves for other promoters but I got lazy cos everyone just got greedy and wanted to jump on the bandwagon so I just sat with Labyrinth."

### How music has changed since he first started DJing:

"It was mostly house and acid - a lot of stuff from America and I was stuck between the two, I couldn't really choose if I liked the acid or the house so I just bought both and I just kept on buying both up until this day.

### What he's buying now:

"Bits of everything cos it's just gone all crazy. I play from hardcore to house to acid - I try and play a selection.

### Why he's not just into hardcore:

"That's just catering for the club, outside that I listen to and play garage and that. That's what I listen to rather than hardcore cos I can't listen to it 24 hours a day, it does my head in.

### What he prefers to play:

"A lot of female vocals cos that's what I like - female vocal/hardcore kind of thing.

"I shop around and pick up what I can get. I honestly don't buy everything that's out. If I like something and I think the club will like it I'll buy it.

I do like to buy a lot of garage because you can sample a lot of that stuff and turn it into hardcore, which they do now days."

He has put out his own records including the DNA remix of Cocaine and Bass Kick: "I've done four or five records and I've got one with me, under the Labyrinth name on the Labyrinth label. On the same kind of female vocal/hardcore breaks sampling but I will be using some female vocals and my own voice as well.

### He has been MCing since first started DJing:

"Part of the reason why I do it is becasue when I was young I was in a Reggae sound and I used to toast on the mic so I thought, I ain't going to leave it, I'll bring it into house and acid and see how it goes down, and it goes down well. There's a couple of other guys in London who do it, some just MC and don't DJ and apart from me I think there's only one other guy who MCs and DJs.

"There's a lot of names out there and they're only one off, just trying to jump on the bandwagon to make a quick earner and then when the promoters realise they ain't really saying anything, you could fuck up their rave and stuff.

"I've never had decks, I just play my records now and again. I don't really hang out with DJs I just do things in the week to keep surviving and the only time I play records in on Friday and Saturday night. I know what I'm capable of so I don't really need to "

## While he doesn't really have a favourite DJ he is into Grooverider, Kenny Ken and Jumpin Jack Frost.

"There's so many kids now days that are really into it. Someone might ask me if I think Grooverider's good and I'll say yeah, and then they'll say 'but what about John Daily from round the corner...' There's so much competition and you can't listen to everyone.

"Some DJs worft play for less that four or five hundred pounds and that's taking the piss, it's ridiculous for a hour's work. It's just not on. We've got a guy down the club called Billy Bunter and he's only 16.

"I think the Labyrinth is the best place to be in England. We get all the nice people from 16 to 46. Anyone that's flying over should come and visit."

tempt the return trip - or they don't have the \$1.50 bridge toll (what bridge?). Sunday day invariably leads to Sunday night and consequently to Bounce (remember the good old days when Sunday meant Bondi?) regardless of work the following day or mere hours later. Unfortunately there are those people who don't make it to Bounce. They may have spent all day Sunday coming down with a SEGA (not to mention all of Saturday and the rest of the week for the chronically Sonic addicted). Or been to one pub too many and been poured into something on wheels and sent home before the magic hour. You can only pity them, but they're sure to find out what they missed out on as soon as their friends are coherent enough to enlighten them.

So that sums up the high point in a ravers week. Monday to Friday is usually spent collecting debts, arguing so you can make up on the next Saturday night (so you'll have something to do when you're out and talk about during the week), getting stoned, playing SEGA, buying and/or

playing records, stealing pot plants from upper class houses on the North Shore (where???), stealing articles of clothing from the same places and so on until the weekend.

The week can deviate from the usual if it comes to pass that on a weekend there is **no event**. If this happens you can:

- 1) Get a normal nights' sleep (ie. unaided by pills)
- 2) Spend Saturday and Sunday night getting so stoned the phone turns yellow and the bong water goes solid
- 3) Start your weekend off at the **pub** on Sunday morning, bearing in mind that the **Courthouse** and the **Bentley Bar** are just about always open
- 4) Orgainse a rave at home all you need is a DJ (and face it there are enough of them to go round), some social pharmecuticals and a light or two to flash on and off as the pills kick in. Lots more fun and guaranteed to be cheaper than the 'real thing'.


