

Yes, go forth and buy, proving yet again that clothes do not a raver make. Or a DJ for that matter.


Dear Charley.

For many of us recovery can mean either of two things. Crawling home, sinking a few green ones and passing out only to be woken up later on in the evening by mates who, coming back from a great


day out, decided to show up only to pay out on you for not being there. For those poor unfortunates Bounce is the only remedy that can be prescribed



hardcore DJ takes control



Yes, Joey Beltram really is coming to Australia. Finally. Known as one of the best hardcore DJs/Producers in the world he'll be appearing on the same bill as the Shamen. And since he doesn't get much chance to DJ these days cos of his recording commitments, this is a rare opportunity.

Joey Beltram, grew up in Queens and started out as a hip hop DJ when he was 12 (and you think the DJs you know are young!). By the time he was 16 he was well into techno and started making his own records. "I put together my own studio which really didn't consist of much but a few tape decks, a reel to reel, a cheap sampler and a little drum machine."

JB says he's always been into 'underground music'. First hip hop, then house and more recently, techno. He's released a heap of his own material through a variety of labels including R & S and his current favourite, Rotterdam Records. Now he's looking to the old Chicago house tracks for inspiration as he sees music moving more in that direction.


"I'm always looking to the future. Right

now I'm also doing tracks that are a lot slower, mellower, and trancey. I really like the Felix stuff, the big Felix record that came out (Don't You Want Me). I think that's a great record. These days it's hard for a record to have a long life span without getting commercial cos records are just so trendy - you play them for two weeks and then they're not cool to play anymore cos all the DJs have got them and they're all playing them, so everyone drops it at the same time. The Felix record is one exception. That proves that it can be done. It came out around July and it's still being played now and it's considered a hit. Nowdays it's hard cos not too many records get that. I got that luckily with my stuff cos it was a the right time when techno did have long life span if it was a good record, and there weren't as many records coming out."

As for 'raves' in New York, as we'd suspected JB says there really aren't any. "There's not much of a rave scene at all.

It's very rare that you hear of raves going on and the ones that do happen are pretty small. There's more of a club scene. There's clubs all over the city and suburbs and that's where all the trends get started. I don't think the rave scene will ever really catch on in New York cos it's too big a city. Where are you going to hold a rave here? It's not like you can just go out to a field somewhere..."

JB is currently spending most of his time producing and remixing and is putting his own label together. Aspiring DJ/remixers should find it well worth while catching him while he's out here, costhis is one DJ who's really making a career from his knowledge of music and expertise in playing it.

From the park sounds of tire screeching can be heard as yet another raver realises that the witches hats were put there


to show them that they were actually skipping across a road.
