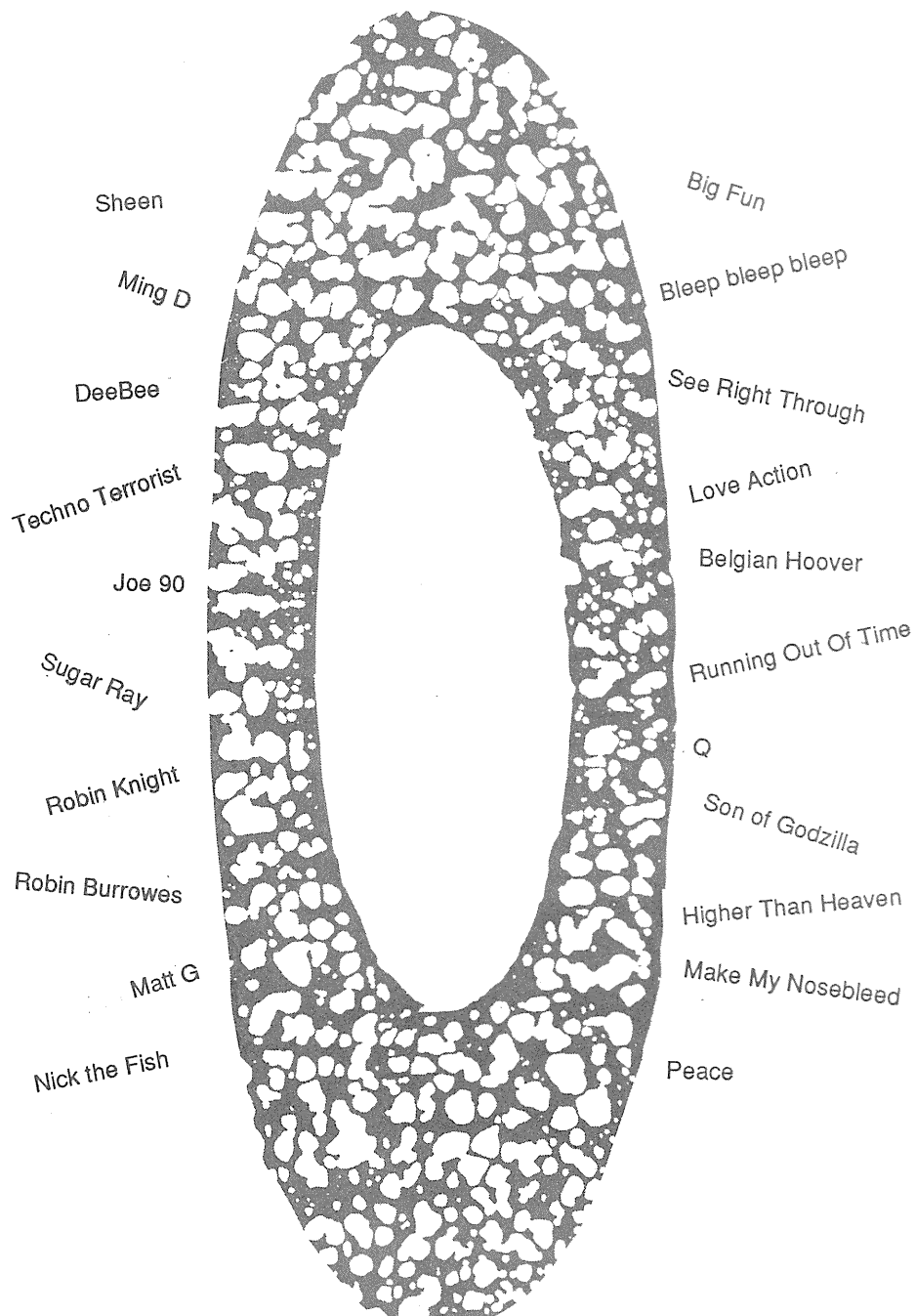
How To Tell When Your Friends Have Lost the Plot

Circus Of Sphere 'Spiral Up'

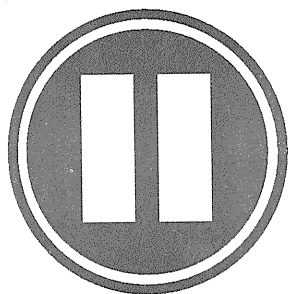
