














EDITORS note

All my sympathies go out to Annas' family but I have to say that I am some what distressed at the stand the media, Annas sister and her friend Nigel have taken against the rave scene. Many people have said in the Rave Scenes defence that drugs are readily available almost anywhere you go, and having grown up in the same area as Anna Wood I know just how easy they are to get in our schools, Frenches Forest, in the past has been notorious for drug dealers, even the Frenches Forest police were in trouble a few years ago for drug related offences many of them suspended or demoted to "desk duties". So please don't try to tell me that the current drug "problem" is associated ONLY within the Rave Scene.

I, as Editor of Juicy Red Apple have always taken an anti drug stance in all Editorial featured in JRA, being a drug free body myself. In the past I have featured two articles titled "How to survive Raves without Chemicals" and have had Tamara from Rave Safe contribute many articles about drug use, never have I been known to promote or condone drug use. Yet Alice Woods friend Nigel, claimed on National Television (The Today Show) after taking a hidden camera to Peace Train that Juicy Red Apple is full of drug implications and innuendo. Well Nigel, I am hereby publicly challenging you to find any drug references (condoning drug use in any way) in ANY Editorial featured in Juicy Red Apple. Because, Nigel, you have made me very upset, please get your facts straight before you go mouthing off on National Television. Last week two young girls were sexually assaulted and beaten to death with a lump of wood in Queensland, a couple of days after this happened one of the papers featured Anna Woods funeral on the front page, page four and an editorial on Page ten. The article about the Police in Queensland finding the girls murderer was featured on Page seven. Here's my problem: A drug dealer may cause someones death by way of the drug they sell to them, but a murderer takes a persons life with his own hands, and by his own sick choice. How is the brutal MURDER of two girls aged 9 and 10 less important than Annas funeral?



huge anthem finish and stumbled out into the sun-




music never gets boring or blunt is a simple one, it consists of the cleverly inserted melody hooks and crazy samples which reveal the special






